

HISTORY OF FREDERICK DOUGLASS FOR AGES 9+



Frederick Douglass was born with the last name "Bailey," but after escaping slavery he changed it to "Douglass." He and his wife chose that name from a poem called "The Lady of the Lake" by Sir Walter Scott.

Frederick Douglass is believed to have been one of the most photographed Americans of the 1800s. More photos were taken of him than of President Abraham Lincoln!


DID YOU KNOW?

In 1872, Frederick Douglass was nominated to become U.S. vice president on the Equal Rights Party ticket (though it happened without anyone letting him know!). Victoria Woodhull, the first American woman ever to run for president, was the party's presidential nominee.
